PROGRAM

Peggy Qualls introduced John and Kristin Ream of local craft brewer, Trek Brewing Company. Kristin is Peggy’s daughter. The 2004 Granville High School grads were introduced as returnees to the area to tell their personal story about a teacher and an aerospace engineer starting a brewery. In amazing harmony, they both presented from the podium together from an on–screen presentation.

Kristin described starting with a home brew kit for John meant to distract him from video games as a hobby. They got married in Granville and moved to Seattle for a 10–year stint by John with Boeing. There, the brew kit grew to a garage–sized competitive brewing operation and aspirations for a new brewery business.

The idea to go into business was first planned to open in Seattle, but market reviews and family encouragement compelled the decision to return to Ohio and Licking County. January 1, 2017 saw the take over of the former Damon’s building on West Church Street. Months later, the family move back came about.

It was a significant renovation. The kitchen was converted to serve as home to a 15–barrel brew system. The old bar became the tap room. The dining room became event space able to hold up to 96 people. Crowd funding was used to build out a new patio as well.

Their presentation moved on to answering questions they’ve been asked in the past ranging from those asking when the craft beer bubble would burst to inquiring about products. The pair cited a brew industry report showing craft beer was up 4% in a year in which beer consumption in general was down 1%. The food options were outlined, and they teased the audience with a description of Trek’s beer offerings and products. Since a long soft opening and a November 2018 grand opening, they have aligned themselves with non–profit efforts and becoming more known as a family–friendly, community gathering space distinguished by pursuit of the local tap rooms segment of the market.

John, notably, described his brew process—“Babysit the yeast and make the hops as happy as possible.” He also described, favorably, Newark’s water as a key ingredient. Kristin answered the question about the origin of the name Trek: “It’s our journey.”
