## PROGRAM

The program speaker needed no introduction, as President **Barb Quackenbush** explained that today's program was on member Engagement and Re-Engagement. She met with the Service Committee last week to discuss the direction for our future in light of the 2021 Plan. After talking about service as our "reason for being," **Barb** re-iterated that service can be several things:

- Volunteering on a monthly service project
- Working on a Rotary committee
- Attending a third Thursday
- Bringing in needed items



**Barb** shared a favorite quote, "If you want to go fast, go alone; if you want to go far, go together!" She also stated that she's proud of the great diversity within this club's membership already, and hopes we continue to capitalize on that.

One continuing goal has been to reform our membership recruitment to put a greater emphasis on service as a reason for membership, with about 24 service opportunities per year. This past winter, members were asked to complete an online survey to help prioritize what we want to do, and the committee reviewed that input. Greater emphasis will go to service projects that align with Rotary International's six areas of focus and which also encourage club networking opportunities. The objectives for these service opportunities are:

- To gain more participation from our Rotary club members
- To share, promote, and talk up our projects amongst our Rotary Club, and
- To support our community

The desire is to have two types of avenues for engagement per month: first, Rotarians Serve-Hands on projects, and second, Rotarians Give-Donating items and/or providing financial support. Specifically suggested as possible service projects for this year: #5 Plastic drive, Turban project, Blood drive, World Polio Day October 24—Pilsners for Polio, joint polio event with the Newark-Heath Rotary club November 1, Annual ride for polio, Look up center Thanksgiving meals, Bell ringing for Salvation Army, possible hat/glove drive.

**Barb** issued a gentle reminder to Committee Chairs: please Contact **Leigh Ann Miller** via email with regard to who is serving/volunteering for service/engagement opportunities to be sure that members are getting credit for their involvement.
