Personal and Professional Development

July Master Class: Control your Emotion, Control Your World.

Emotions are centered in the brain, as are your thoughts. This sets up the classic conflict of human nature: emotion vs. reason. Inability to deal with stress, anger, loss of emotional control, by any name is the cause of killings, shootings, suicides, divorce, bad political decisions, and considerable mayhem. Conflict is inevitable; violence, in any form, is not. Our society is a huge mixture of religions, politics, attitudes, beliefs, cultures and ethnicity's. On a daily basis we are confronted with people of a different view or we remain on the other side of the street. Our short time together will begin a basis for dealing with such moments in a constructive manner. A better understanding of how the brain functions will give you greater emotional control when in those challenging moments.

Speaker Jim Halderman has taught court ordered, company ordered, and in prisons, for 21 years in anger and conflict management. He is currently on the board of Stout Street Foundation, Colorado's largest drug and alcohol rehabilitation, where he also teaches anger management. A Past District Governor, Jim has been a Rotarian since 1991 and serves as the Ombudsman for District 5450 and chair of the District's Peace Committee. He was one of 26 in the US to

be trained in the new peace endeavors of Rotary International and the Institute of Economics and Peace. Recently, Jim was honored with the *Service Above Self Award* from Rotary International.
