6690 Youth Exchange Committee starts planning for students in 22-23

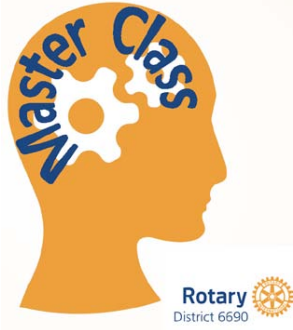

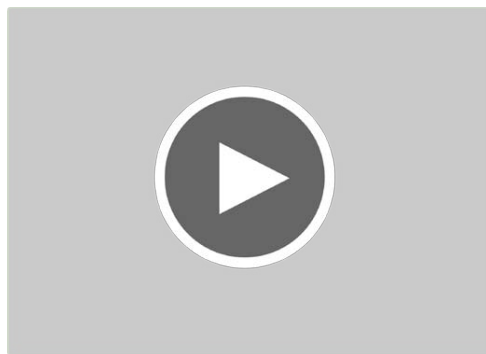
Emotions are centered in the brain, as are your thoughts. This sets up the classic conflict of human nature: emotion vs. reason. Inability to deal with stress, anger, loss of emotional control, by any name is the cause of killings, shootings, suicides, divorce, bad political decisions, and considerable mayhem.

Conflict is inevitable; violence, in any form, is not.

Our society is a huge mixture of religions, politics, attitudes, beliefs, cultures and ethnicity ♦s. On a daily basis **we are confronted with people of a different view** or we remain on the other side of the street. Our short time together will begin a basis for dealing with such moments in a constructive manner. A better understanding of how the brain functions will give you greater emotional control when in those challenging moments.

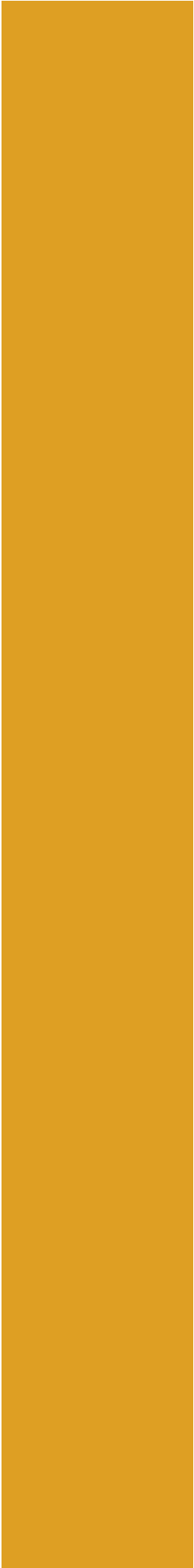
