Hank Arnold introduced speaker, Desmond Timmons. Desmond works for the Department of Natural Resources of Georgia and currently manages FDR state park. Desmond, introduced Ketti Flory which recently purchased and now operates, with his wife Tracy, the stables inside the state park. Keith gave a brief overview of the recent renovations and changes of the stables. The stables are open 7 days a week, 10:00-5:00 and last ride is at 4:00. There are multiple trails and types of rides to choose from which accommodates all levels of riders. Keith is trying to secure additional land around the stables to allow for camping and horse trailer parking which has been a request of riders for some time. Keith hopes to make this happen in the near future

Desmond presented an overview for the Park and its history. FDR is the largest park in Georgia. Park was built by the CCC and the 13 and 23 acres lakes were actually hand dug by these men. The visitors center was built in 1937 and was originally an Inn and restaurant. The park was initially a National Park and the state purchased it in 1945 for \$1000. Desmond reviewed all of the amenities the park has to offer to include but not limited to hiking, camping, primitive camping, and picnic areas. Desmond encouraged all those interested to become members of "Friends of the Park". Friends of the Park offer significant discounts for camping, park passes etc. He also noted that some of the membership money is returned back to our local park. In recent years the Park has been able to purchase things such as canoes, life jackets and paddles for visitors to enjoy through the donations of "Friends of the Park". Desmond entertained questions.
