Expectations of Membership

All members accept the **Four Way Test** as the cornerstone of all action, keeping these four brief questions in mind in all decisions we make: Of the things we think, say, or do: 1. Is it the TRUTH? 2. Is it FAIR to all concerned? 3. Will it build GOODWILL and BETTER FRIENDSHIPS? 4. Will it be BENEFICIAL to ALL CONCERNED?

The **Object of Rotary** is to encourage and foster the ideal of service as a basis of worthy enterprise and, in particular, to encourage and foster: FIRST - The development of acquaintances as an opportunity for service; SECOND - High, ethical standards in business and professions; the recognition of worthiness of all useful occupations; and the dignifying of each Rotarian's occupation as an opportunity to serve society; THIRD - The application of the ideal of service in each Rotarian's personal, business and community life; and FOURTH - The advancement of international understanding, goodwill, and peach through a world fellowship of business and professional persons united in the ideal of service.

Commitment of Time and Talent

REQUIRED: Service Above Self

- 1. Complete the Red Badge Scorecard by attending at least one New Member Orientation meeting and part 1 of Rotary Leadership Training Institute and at least 5 of the 8 optional assignments on the scorecard. The program can be completed in as little as 6 months, but averages as much as 8-12 months.
- 2. Maintain a minimum attendance record of 50% at regular lunch meetings. This requirement may be met in the following ways:
 - Attend a regularly scheduled Rotary meeting anywhere in the world
 - Attend a club committee meeting
 - Volunteer at a Rotary activity or event
 - Attend an official Rotary social event
 - Perform a fundraising activity for the Club and/or the 1090 Foundation
 - Attend other official District, Zone or International Rotary Activity

RECOMMENDED:

- 1. Participate in at least one community service project annually
- 2. Serve on at least one non-fundraising community service committee
- 3. Buy or sell at least five raffle tickets annually
- 4. Participate in a fundraising event or activity as a volunteer or sponsor, register for the event or encourage others to do so
- 5. Participate in the annual Installation Dinner & Silent Auction
- 6. Participate in at least one Rotary Club social event annually
- 7. Introduce at least one new prospective member to the club annually

Commitment of Dollars

REQUIRED:

- 1. Initiation fee of \$100 and Deposit of \$280 (total \$380) upon joining
- 2. Quarterly dues of \$280 for regular membership payable at the beginning of each quarter. Dues include the cost of regular lunch meetings (subject to adjustments at the discretion of the Board of Directors). Please refer to Membership Categories Brochure for fees for other membership categories.

EXPECTED:

1. Quarterly donation of \$25 (\$100 per annum) to the Rotary Foundation as a Sustaining Member. When the accrued contributions reach \$1,000, the Sustaining Member becomes a Paul Harris Fellow. All Sustaining Member contributions are donated to the Rotary International Foundation, Inc. a 501 (c)3 corporation.

Registration for Fundraising Activities \$ 20 - \$175
Social Events \$ 0 - \$150
Successful bids at silent auction \$ 50 - \$1,000 ++
