The 4 Foundation Funds



1. The Permanent Fund

Funds invested in perpetuity, about \$8,000,000 earnings yearly applied to fund educational & humanitarian programs.

2. The Annual Fund

Yearly giving, held for three years, the interest earned supports the operation of the Foundation, the entire amount returned to Districts for use as Global Grants & District Grants.

Foundation Grant Basics



The basic requirements for any grant of any size:

1. **\$100 per member giving to the Rotary Foundation**
2. **At least one member trained/certified every year**
3. **A signature on the memorandum of understanding**

Global Grant Key Points

1. Most global grants are “Humanitarian” grants.
2. You need a Host Club where the grant will be used, that Club needs to be qualified.
3. The District needs to be notified of your intentions to pursue a grant.
4. You will need to demonstrate how the project will be sustainable.
5. A community assessment process needs to be undertaken by the host club. Failure to do an adequate assessment is the most frequent reason for TRF to reject the request.
6. Minimum project cost is \$30,000 - at least 20% must come from Rotary Clubs.
