Rotary District 7610 District Youth Service Chair (formerly New Generations Chair)

Job Description

Purpose: To develop, implement, and support Rotary Youth Service (formerly New Generations) activities and programs across the District.

Qualifications: Appointed by the District Governor, the Youth Service Chair, must be a Rotarian in the district, undergo a criminal background check and complete all training required by the District 7610 Youth Protection Policy.

Duties and Responsibilities: Working under the direction of the District Governor or designee, the individual will:

- Supervise District Youth Programs through District Governor appointed Chairs for District Youth programs: Youth contests (Speech, Essay and Music), ROTARACT, Interact and Youth Exchange programs;
- Be knowledgeable about ESSEX Youth Exchange program requirements and facilitates planning and communication between ESSEX program officers, the Youth Exchange Chair and District Officers;
- Encourage and facilitate others to engage young people in appropriate Rotary and youth service programs and activities across the District;
- Work with the Chairs of District Youth Service programs (Interact, ROTARACT, RYLA, and Youth Exchange) facilitates relationships and communications with District Officers and Rotary clubs;
- Provide assistance and support for problem solving as needed;
- Promote Youth Service Month across the District;
- Ensure District Youth Program personnel are well prepared to provide leadership to the district and program assigned. This includes but is not limited to providing supplemental training, materials distribution, explanation and clarification of District and Rotary International resources to support their programs;

- Review the District website to ensure that posted materials are accurate and up to date, working with youth program chairs and the District webmaster to update as needed on an on-going basis;
- Oversee the youth service program budget expenditures to ensure conformance with annual budget allocations;
- Participate as a member of the District Youth Protection Committee.
