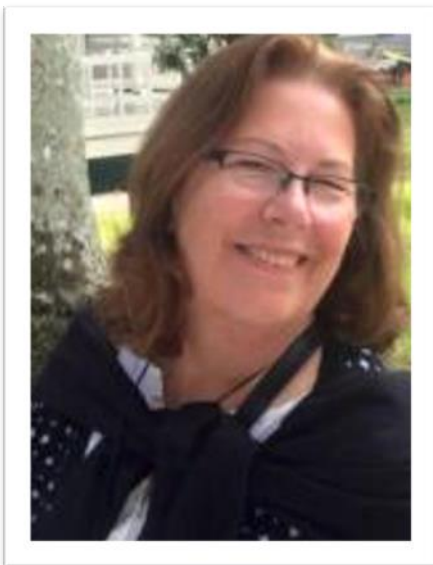
## Area 10 celebrates member giving to TRF

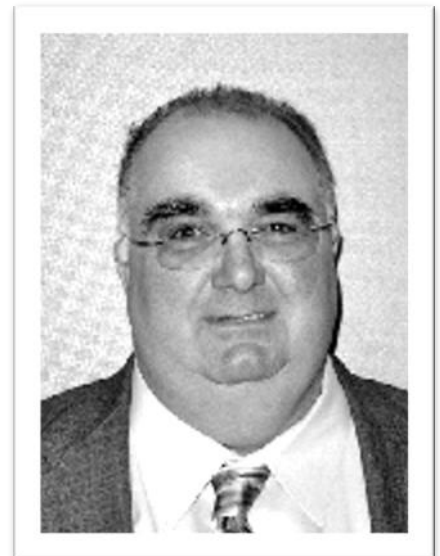

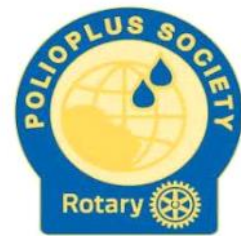
