

PROGRAM LAST WEEK

Senator Tom Young introduced our January 13, 2014, speaker, Lieutenant Governor Glenn McConnell, who addressed the Club of the recent state of the Office of Aging and South Carolina's senior population. When the former Senate President Pro Tempore suddenly ascended into his current position in early 2012, the Lt. Governor stated that he did not fully understand how his role as leader of the Office on Aging would lead him to view an alternative lens of what South Carolina's seniors face.

While meeting with seniors around the State and learning about the pressing issues confronting our seniors, the Lt. Governor discovered worrisome statistics, which some include:

- 1. Our senior population is projected to double to 1.8 million by 2030;
- 2. Since 2007, the State's funding share for the Office of Aging has been cut by 48%;
- 3. 1 in 11 of SC seniors is at risk of hunger;
- 4. Over one-third of SC seniors lives depend solely on Social Security payments, some of which are as little as \$710; and
- 5. Over 25% of those 85 years of age or older require institutional care.

Though troubled that our seniors' critical needs have often been ignored by the government and that seniors persistently lack effective advocacy, the Lt. Governor stated that he and the Office on Aging are determined to reverse this trend to ensure that all of our seniors' needs are met.
