# **JANUARY** STUDENT OF THE MONTH





PERSPECTIVE

Last Wednesday's edition of the "Aiken Standard" carried a very nice news report of an Aiken native who commanded a dramatic rescue last Sunday night of three adults and a baby from the sea off the coast of Hawaii. That pilot of that rescue helicopter comes from a long line of military and patriotic individuals. That pilot's sixth great-grandfather was a Colonel in the Revolutionary War (notwithstanding the fact that he was on the British side and was a Tory)! During the War of Secession (Civil War for those Yankees in our midst), he had five great-greatgrandfathers who fought for the Confederacy (one lost an arm at Gettysburg). During the Great War (WWI), that pilot had a great-uncle who fought in the trenches in France (the family still has his WWI blanket). During the height of the Iraq War (2005) the pilot's brother, a Major in the SC National Guard, commanded a South Carolina company of 178 men in the conflict there and brought all 178 back without a loss or injury. Needless to say, that pilot's mother, Linda, and father, Edward O., are very proud. (Please pardon my puffed-up, patriotic, political, pontifications that are penned, proclaimed, or published)!
