


Last week, student host, Rakesh Jasani, introduced South Aiken High School student, David Stoner, a final time before

## PROGRAM LAST WEEK

Last week, Dr. Susan Winsor introduced our speaker, Molly Cooper. Molly has 14 years of tower industry experience and is now heading up the new credit program that trains students on tower industry skills. The program is the only one of its kind in the United States.

Molly believes the tower industry provides great opportunities for work for graduates because currently there are labor shortages for this type of worker and there aren't many qualified training programs from which to recruit employees. Molly told Rotarians that there was a need for a cohesive educational program because properly trained climbers are aging, those with 3-5 years of experience are improperly trained, there were only short-term training programs, and there was no single training location for tower industry workers to learn what is needed for the first two years. Aiken Technical College has accreditation for the Technician I classes and are working on receiving accreditation on several more programs related to towers.
