



Bill Tucker introduced our speaker and fellow Rotarian, Jane Page Thompson, at our last meeting. Jane Page unveiled plans to create an Honor Park in Aiken County. The idea for the park originated within the 2014-2015 Leadership Aiken Class where

funds above what were needed for their class project were set aside in hopes of starting this project.

The park will honor the first responders and Public Safety persons in Aiken County. There are currently 36 entities that serve as first responders and each entity would be represented on the monument in the park.

Between \$185,000 and \$225,000 needs to be raised to complete the project that is requested to be installed on the grounds of the new Aiken County facility.

In total, 19 first responders have perished in the line of duty. The park will honor them as well as horses and canines that have been killed in the line of duty.

#### TEN YEARS AGO - FEBRUARY 2005

In February 2005 we were helping
Rotary International celebrate the 100th year
founding of Rotary. At the Houndslake Country Club
our Club joined the two other Rotary Clubs in town,
The Sunrise Club and the Aiken South Club, for a
banquet and celebration. District Governor, Richard
Waugh, kicked off the program with a brief history of
the founding of Rotary in Chicago in 1905. Then each
of the three Clubs gave a brief history of their Club. It
was a delightful meeting and a great time to celebrate
the achievements and history of one of the world's
most active and beneficial organizations. (Too bad
that the Aiken South Club did not continue for another
ten years and could celebrate and remember with us
today the 110th anniversary of Rotary International)

#### HISTORICAL NOTE OF SADNESS

At our last Rotary meeting on 9 February one of our newer members, James Goodman, sat at a table where I sat. He had just been inducted into the Club in late fall and often sat at a table where I sat or sometimes sat with Dean Sackett, who sponsored him into the Club. We, at the table, had great conservation with James at our last Rotary meeting on 9 February. He was in a jovial mood, having just returned from a weekend visit where he got to hold his first great grandchild. It was such a sobering message that was received on Sunday 15 February that James had died suddenly. I had know and been associated with James for about 30 years and considered him a good friend and wonderful Rotarian (He had been one of the founding members of the Aiken South Rotary Club). He was well respected and known in the Aiken County Community. He was an outstanding member of the Aiken County Historical Commission having just been reappointed to that body by our own Rotarian and County Council member, Mrs. Furgiele. His service on Wednesday in Jackson was moving and his untimely passing is a great loss for Aiken County and our Club.
