

#### PROGRAM LAST WEEK by Dexter Price



Painting a bright and optimistic picture for South Carolina's future, Governor Henry McMaster addressed Aiken Rotarians and guests saying that economic development is crucial to the hoped-for outcome for the state. Serving as the 117th governor of the Palmetto State, McMaster, himself a Rotarian in Columbia. urged that a good job is a cure for many of the state's problems and that education, particularly through the special schools program and technical colleges (Forest Mahan was heard to be cheering!), can be the enemy of poverty. Asked to address the

SCANA Santee Cooper default and the MOX project uncertainty at the Savannah River Site, McMaster described the nuclear reactor construction project as a "big mess" explaining that there's plenty of responsibility to go around and that the state's ratepayers should not bear the burden of \$4.3bn bonded indebtedness. As for the precarious funding status of the Mixed Oxide Fuel project at SRS, the governor says he told U.S. Department of Energy Secretary Perry during a recent visit to SRS that there is no good alternative to MOX which is nearly 70% complete. McMaster assumed the position of governor following the appointment of then-governor Nikki Hailey to be U.S. Ambassador to the United Nations in the Trump administration. He previously served as South Carolina's Lt. Governor, Attorney General and as a U.S. Attorney.



## HISTORICAL PERSPECTIVE

#### OUR PAST — WE GOT STARTED IN FEBRUARY 1939

February was a very big month back in 1939. On February 8, 16 business and professional men met at the Commercial Hotel (now Hotel Aiken) to "take steps for the organization of a



Rotary Club in Aiken". They met with a Porter Carswell of the Waynesboro GA Rotary Club. The weather was beautiful, daffodils and camellias were blooming. These men became the nucleus of "a complete cross section of the community's economic life". They decided to have monthly meetings at 1:30pm on Wednesdays at the Commercial Hotel and the first meeting was held on February 15. Wilbur Thornhill, the District Governor from Charleston, attended and an application for a Charter was submitted. B. J. King was elected President.

The club's next meeting was on Wednesday, March 17 and some 200 people were invited to attend. The subject of a Rotary Club in Aiken got first page coverage from the weekly Aiken Standard and Review on three issues

in February and two or three more in March. Why do you think our Rotary Club got so much excellent coverage by a small weekly newspaper? The answer is — the editor of the newspaper was B. J. King! And there is a grand and heart-warming connection with the past — our current member **Bill Howell** is a nephew of — yes— B.J. King.

To learn what happened at the March 1939 meeting with 200 guests, and what they had for dinner, watch for next month's HISTORICAL PERSPECTIVE. And learn how we found that original charter just a few years ago in a very strange place!

#### FROM THE GEARS 10 AND 20 YEARS AGO IN FEBRUARY

In 2008 **Barry Adams** and **Leighton McLendon** were the hosts for our student guests, and **Fred Andrea** and **Rick Osbon** were on the Board of Directors. In 1998, **Dr. Mark Meyer** was a speaker on the subject of Haiti's need for medical help. Senator Shane Massey gave one of his first speeches as SC's youngest state senator. And **Richard Herring** joined the Club and is now a long-term Sergeant at Arms.
