PROGRAM LAST WEEK

After an introduction by Liz Neal, our speaker last week, John Magill, State Director of the South Carolina Department of Mental Health, spoke to the club about the Department's history and current work.

John began work at the South Carolina Department of Mental Health in the late 1960's. He also served as Assistant Director of the Georgia Department of

Mental Health and Mental Retardation, and in 1977; became the Georgia State Director for Alcohol and Drug Abuse before coming back to become the State Director of the South Carolina Department of Mental Health in 2006.


