PROJECT 1: BOOKS FOR SCHOOL THAT WAS DAMAGED BY A VOLCANO IN PACAYA

After a volcano erupted and destroyed much of the school and supplies, our local clubs stepped up and replaced many of the books.

PROJECT 2: MEDICAL EQUIPMENT FOR HANDICAPPED CHILDREN

Instead of money, the local clubs collected wheelchairs, crutches, and walkers. One and a half cargo containers were shipped to Guatemala with the new supplies.

PROJECT 3: SCHOOL SUPPLIES FOR HANDICAPPED CHILDREN

Area clubs raised \$700 dollars and the district matched that with another \$700. This allowed the school to buy school material for the students. The next project will likely fund computers (two have already been collected).

PROJECT 4: BOOKS AND MATERIALS FOR ESCUELA OFICIAL DE PAZYULOS CONCEPCION DE **CEDRO**

Our area clubs helped this school, burned by the volcano, by raising \$800 and asking the district to match that donation with another \$800. The \$1600 bought books & materials for a year. This effort also resulted in repainting the school with donated paint as well as seeing that two bathrooms were installed with toilets.
