Sandra Jordan. Chancellor of USC Aiken introduced our speaker—Dr. Harris Pastides, President of the University of South Carolina System.

Dr. Pastides. Rotarian and Paul Harris recipient explained that education is key and universities must respond to declining

graduation rates by making a college education more accessible. Students now have the option of Palmetto College offering online coursework and a reengineered academic calendar providing a full curriculum over the summer to expedite graduation and entry into the job market.

Despite declining government funding, USC will limit tuition increases. Instead they are looking for new revenue sources and have already secured two-thirds of the \$2 billion goal for the university's unprecedented capital campaign.
