Last week Rotarians Lyn Kenney and Club President, Joe Shields, presented to the Club the International Projects Update and the Rotary Grant Fair in Guatemala. Joe spoke about our Club's, in addition to four other local Rotary Clubs, visit to Guatemala this past March to

assist an impoverished community that has been recently impacted by volcanic activity. The group's itinerary led them to two schools and an area lake that have been affected by the nearby Pacaya volcano and by deforestation and erosion. Over the course of the trip, the group provided supplies such as paint, TVs, DVDs and VHS tapes, along with trees, biodegradable bags, and latrines to help mitigate the area's ongoing crisis.

Lyn Kenney shared her experiences at the Central American Rotary Project Fair in Antigua, Guatemala in January 2014. All seven Central American countries take turns hosting the "Uniendo America" Project Fair, and this year's fair was held at the Casa Santo Domingo, which is one of only seven 5 Star hotels in the world to be placed on an historic site. Districts and Clubs from the U.S. and Canada traveled to meet with Clubs from all over Central America to exchange ideas and initiatives on improving the lives of Central Americans.


