#### PROGRAM LAST WEEK

Rotarian Brian Bernard introduced speaker Derek Dugan, head of the Aiken Chapter of the American Red Cross. The Red Cross, founded in 1881 by Clara Barton and chartered by the U.S. Congress in 1900, operates in 180 countries across the globe.

First, the Red Cross shelters, feeds, and cares for disaster victims. Last year alone, they provided 33,700 toothbrushes

to victims across the U.S. Within our area, they respond to about 8 house fires each year. Last year, they served 333 area residents in 103 disasters, including the Ice Storm.

**Second**, the Red Cross provides a safe blood supply, supporting nearly half of the U.S. blood supply needs. Locally donated blood stays local, including supplying Aiken Regional Medical Center. Rotarians can become heroes by donating blood. Upcoming blood drives are scheduled May 28<sup>th</sup> and June 25<sup>th</sup> at Aiken Mall.

**Third**, the Red Cross serves as the official communication channel to notify active duty military members of family emergencies – most commonly births, deaths, and illnesses of family members. They operate two full-time call centers and provide support and financial assistance to help military members get home.

Fourth, the Red Cross teaches lifesaving skills, including first aid, baby sitter, lifeguard, and water safety certifications. Rotarians can become heroes by signing up for on-line or local classes, and by downloading Red Cross smart phone Apps for First Aid, Hurricane, Earthquake, Wildfire, and Tornado. 


#### OUR PAST - "THE GEAR" MAY 1994
