Following an introduction by **Betty Ryberg**, actor **Lancer Shull** shared some insight into his life in the motion picture industry. Throughout Shull's presentation, he showed us various clips and pictures that he filmed in, including *Lincoln*, which stars Daniel Day-Lewis.

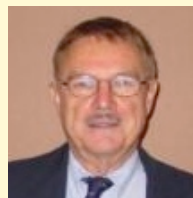
