SRS he was "Boss," he once answered regularly to "Admiral", at the Olympic trials, he was known as "Crew Captain," and now he frequently answers to "Dad" and "Grandpa". To explain his classification of Nuclear Operations, he described it as safe, demanding, and precise.

Some of Chuck's experiences included spending six months underwater in a submarine with 140 other people. He also served as President of SRS to 10,000 employees of the average age of 51, at a 300 square mile facility.

Chuck also alluded to the importance of SRS to our community with the example that in the \$3,000,000 that was raised for United Way, employees and retirees of the site contributed \$2,000,000 of that money.
