PREVIEW OF THE "THE MUSIC MAN" PRESENTED BY THE AIKEN COMMUNITY PLAYHOUSE



PROGRAM LAST WEEK

Rotarian and Chamber President David Jameson introduced Dr. Cliffton Jones, who summarized key findings from a recently completed benchmark study on the condition of Aiken's economic vitality and quality of life. Dr. Jones and his co-author, Dr. Sanela Porca, indicated areas in which Aiken is doing

better than the State or Nation as a whole include: 1) higher total employment and retail sales levels than before the recession, 2) higher population growth, 3) significantly higher levels of educational attainment, and 4) rising pending home sales. Areas in which the reports notes concerns are: 1) slowing growth in population and personal income levels, 2) reduced employment in the highest-paying industry sectors, 3) recent decreases in retail sales, and 4) new construction starts at only 60-70 percent of their pre-recession peaks. The report concludes that economic stability requires some regular, consistent growth of the population, employment levels, wages, personal income, new construction starts and housing values.
