



Rotarian Dr. Susan Windsor introduced speaker Mindy Mets, who heads the Nuclear Workforce Initiative (NWI) to grow local talent to serve the region's nuclear industry. The US's only new nuclear reactors are being constructed in South Carolina and Georgia. A study completed in 2009 by the non-profit Savannah River Site Community Reuse

Organization, indicated 10,000 new nuclear workers would be needed over the next 10 years, in various technical and construction fields. NWI's guiding philosophy is that citizens of our region should have the opportunity to develop the skills needed for jobs in our region. Supported by \$3.8 million in federal grant money and leveraged with \$4.6 million from local nuclear employers and educational institutions, over the first four years, NWI has enrolled 300 students in new curricula; involved 1,000 students in Science, Technical, Engineering and Math (STEM) education programs; graduated 60 students; and established local internships and new jobs.

MTU FIELDTRIP

Nearly 90 Rotarians visited the MTU Aiken Plant, which produces world-class diesel engines and components, and was named the SC Chamber's 2014 Small/Medium Manufacturer of the Year. MTU moved to Aiken in 2010 and employs about 300 people. Jens Baumeister, MTU's director of operations, overviewed the German company's scope, noting Aiken now manufactures several engines that had been constructed either overseas or in the Detroit area. The MTU Aiken Plant has dramatically decreased the cost and time to manufacture these specialty engines, so much so that some orders which had been planned to be constructed elsewhere are now being assigned to the Aiken Plant.
