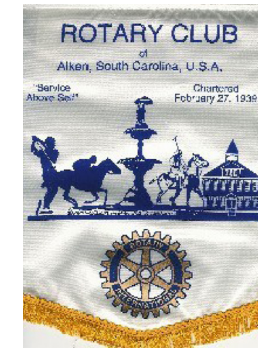

PROGRAM LAST WEEK by John Lindsay



“In the interest of transparency and member input, President Will convened an information and input assembly last week (10/8) to communicate the results and recommendation of the recently completed “Dues and Local Community Giving” Advisory Committee report. The ten-member advisory committee, chaired by Regena Brackett, was created by the board to review the current club dues structure and the methods used to distribute club funding. The club’s current process was reviewed, compared with policies and processes of other clubs in Rotary District 7750.

The initial board action approved a quarterly dues increase of \$51.25 which prompted expressions of concern

among some club members. This in turn resulted in the creation by the board of the advisory committee. The committee recommended a quarterly dues increase of \$5.00 consisting of the mandatory payment of club operations (\$78.00) and meals (\$148.00) as well as the required payment of \$10.00 per quarter for the scholarship fund, an increase of \$4.00 over the current quarterly rate. All other dues payments such as the \$25.00 to the Rotary Foundation would be voluntary but “suggested” (or “expected”).

The club board will meet today (10/15) at its regular meeting—open to the membership- to consider the advisory committee recommendation.”
