

Last week, Rotarian Greg Roberts introduced our speaker, Nelson C. Smoot. Mr. Smoot spoke to the club about the USS Scorpion, which was a nuclear submarine of the United States Navy. The USS Scorpion was lost on May 22, 1968. Scorpion was underway for a Mediterranean Sea deployment when it went down. Ninety-nine men were on board.
