

PROGRAM LAST WEEK

Last week, President Joe Lewis introduced our speaker, Mike Crapps. Mike is the President and CEO of First Community Bank. Mike spoke to the club about the Federal Reserve.

In 1836, after the closing of Second Bank, the nation was without a central bank or nationally issued currency and instead had fragments of small banks. In 1890, there was a call for action. This resulted in the 1910 Jekyll Island "Duck Hunt" which created the Federal Reserve System with 12 regional clearinghouses and required mandatory membership for national banks. Today, the Federal Reserve's mission includes: conducting the nation's monetary policy by influencing the monetary and credit conditions in the economy in pursuit of maximum employment, stable prices, and moderate long-term interest rates; supervising and regulating banking institutions to ensure the safety and soundness of the nation's banking and financial system and to protect the credit rights of consumers; maintaining the stability of the financial system and containing systemic risk that may arise in financial markets; and providing financial services to depository institutions, the U.S. government, and foreign official institutions, including playing a major role in operating the nation's payments system.
