PROGRAM LAST WEEK by John Lindsay



With military veterans ranging from WWII to the Irag/Afghanistan war in attendance. Aiken Rotarians heard Dwight Bradham, Director of the Aiken County Veterans Affairs Office urge greater awareness and understanding of the benefits available to veterans who've served our country. The former military officer who now serves local veterans says his office currently supports 13,939 Aiken County vets and has serviced compensation claims totaling a hefty seven-figures since 2016. Bradham says many vets are simply not aware of the benefits and compensation to which

they are entitled because of their military service. Many vets, he says, do not retain or have disposed of documents such as the DD-214 which is needed to establish a claim. Many vets of the Viet Nam War are unawares of the benefits they may be entitled to because of exposures to Agent Orange, an established carcinogen responsible for various forms of cancers. Survivors of deceased veterans such as spouses and children are often unfamiliar with benefits available to them. Veterans in South Carolina, for example, who are permanently and totally disabled may be entitled to significant property tax exemptions and education benefits for their children. In serving our country, vets have gone the extra mile and many have made the ultimate sacrifice which entitles them and their survivors to the benefits they've earned.
