

PROGRAM LAST WEEK by Tara Reeder



Our quest speaker last week was one of our very own, Rotarian Karen Poteat. She educated us on the many ways families can avoid making common mistakes when it comes to a loved one who may be experiencing cognitive changes. During the presentation she stated that this time of year that we may discover that "grandma or grandpa" might have some cognitive changes. This being because we are spending time with them over the holidays. Some of the signs might be people holding onto expired foods, medication, or being untidy. They will make excuses as to why this is. If dementia is suspected, ask open ended guestions. Try to observe and not hover. The person having these changes may try to cover up what is happening. Karen

also showed us that it is not all bad news. If these cognitive changes are addressed early the outcome is more positive. If families ignore the early warning signs, you may lose the opportunity. In Karen's presentation, one of the other mistakes families make is trying to handle this situation on their own. That is cases where a family member has early signs of dementia you be better served being treated by an expert in this area of medicine. We also learned that there are 3 basic rules for care-giving, 1. Trust your instinct. 2. Make time for yourself. 3. Never keep fixedent and preparation H on the same self! She also stated the importance of the patient being connected to others. Isolation least to inactivity and depression. The good news is that we live in the only community in the nation that has a program that is specifically designed to help people with cognitive changes. That is Club Thrive. Their moto is "We Cure Boredom." This is a great way to keep grandma or grandpa engaged, which in return may slow down the cognitive deterioration.
