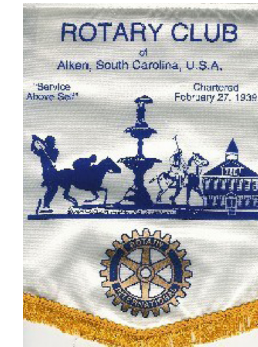

PROGRAM LAST WEEK by Gil Allensworth



Savannah River Site Citizens Advisory Board Chairman and Rotarian Gil Allensworth shared information about the Savannah River Site Citizens Advisory Board, or CAB, as it is more commonly known.

Mr. Allensworth explained that the CAB is composed entirely of citizen volunteers from the area that surround the Department of Energy's Savannah River Site. While SRS is known for its highly skilled and technical workforce, it was explained that the members of the CAB are not scientific experts, but rather, concerned citizens who want to better understand the complexities of SRS including its economic impacts to our community, environmental impacts, projected future as well as

groundbreaking science.

Allensworth shared that the CAB is concerned about the future of the environmental cleanup due to budgetary concerns. The CAB recently sent a recommendation to DOE urging an aggressive plan to educate politicians, community stakeholders and the community at large about a pension deficit that DOE is going to have to fund for the foreseeable future. As explained, the funding of the SRS pension could displace up to 20% of the SRS environmental management operating budget so to insure the pension remains solvent.

The CAB is also paying close attention to the 2019 SRS Budget. In 2018, SRS received less than its budget request from Congress, while other DOE sites received significantly more than what those sites requested. In the House and Senate 2019 budgets, SRS again received less than requested (-7.5%) while other sited received considerably more (14.5% or higher) than requested.

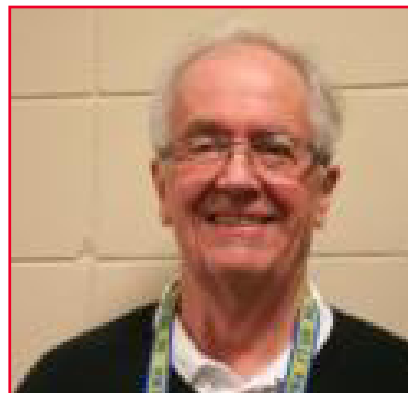
