The 24 students selected to participate will own and operate fully formed and functioning business by the end of the school year, which may be carried on after their graduation from the program. They brainstorm ideas for business creation, write a business plan, pitch their idea to potential investors, obtain funding, and launch their company or social movement.

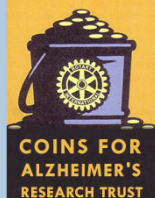
THE ROTARY CLUB OF AIKEN WELCOMES NEW MEMBER: DANIEL ZALOUDEK
