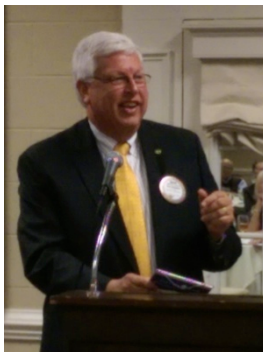

Last week we had two banner presentations. The first presentation was by David Jameson. David attended a Rotary Club in Austria.

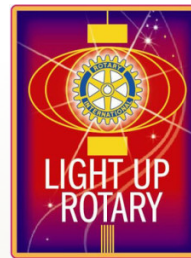
There were 29 people present and was held at 7:30 in the evening.

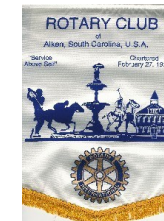

Rotarian Will Williams introduced speaker John Pownall, plant manager for Kimberly-Clark in Beech Island. John discussed the history of how Kimberly-Clark, which was formed in 1872 as a paper and newsprint company, grew to a company that employs 57,000 workers and enjoyed \$21.2 billion in net sales last year. Kimberly-Clark's culture is driven by several key values: being authentic,

accountable, and caring.

The Beech Island Plant was opened in 1968 and now hosts a 3.2 million square foot facility on the 1200 acre site. Several products that are manufactured at this facility are conventional tissues (Scott 1000, Kleenex and similar products), baby and child care products (Pull Ups, Huggies, and Goodnites), through-air dried tissues (Cottonelle, Scott Extrasoft/Naturals/Towels) and cleansing cloths (Cottonell, Scott).

Products manufactured in Beech Island represent 8% of total net sales for Kimberly-Clark. Reasons Kimberly-Clark decided to open a plant in Aiken included the Savannah River, distribution, workforce, and city and community relationships.

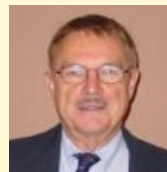
