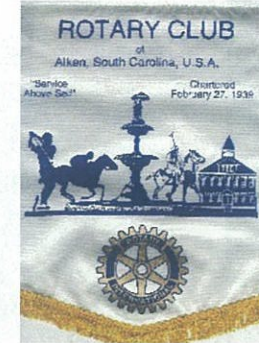

PROGRAM LAST WEEK by Mallory Holley



On Monday, October 15th, 2018, Carol Burdette, the 7750 District Governor, shared with our club about the district and why she is passionate about the work that Rotary does locally and internationally. During her first term as District Governor in the late 2000s, 26,000 children died per day from preventable causes. Today that number is still high, but it has dropped to 15,000 and some of that drop can be attributed to Rotary International and the work they do around the world with water projects and polio vaccinations. In 1985, 350,000 people/children were diagnosed with polio and at this time there have been only 18 confirmed cases in 2018. Those 18 cases were in Pakistan and Afghanistan. District Governor Burdette encouraged club members to never underestimate the difference you can make and that we should be proud to wear our Rotary pins, shirts and hats in our community. As Rotarians, we

should work to "Be the Inspiration" and to live out Rotary's motto of Service above Self. One of her main goals this year is to increase the district's contributions to CART. DG Burdette lost a close family friend to Alzheimer's and she believes that the funding that CART provides will help find a cure. She encouraged members to make a \$1000 donation in honor of someone that they know that is or has battled Alzheimer's. The district's goal is to raise \$100,000 for CART. In conclusion, district 7750 has quite a few upcoming events that District Governor Burdette invited our club members to attend:
