February is Rotary Peace and Conflict Prevention/ Resolution Month. February is African-American History Month. February 23rd is the 116th Anniversary of Rotary International!

The month of February, though the shortest month of the year, opens opportunities for our Rotary family!

Our District would like to **THANK** our Rotary Clubs, **Rotaract** Clubs, **Interact** Clubs and Rotary Community Corp for their hard work during the Pandemic by making \$1,000 grants available from our "Rainy Day" funds. These grants will require local community assessments as we work our way through the phase II of the Pandemic. The funds are being held available through March 31, 2021 to allow each organization to complete the community assessment and to fill out the simple application form.

We encourage the Rotary Clubs, **Rotaract** Clubs and Community Corp to work in partnership to expand the scope of the grants. Please include your Interact Clubs in the community engagement. Any new Rotary Clubs, **Rotaract** Clubs and Rotary Community Corp Clubs that are chartered before the March 31, 2021 deadline will be eligible to participate in the \$1,000 grants. We are excited to make these funds available during these most difficult times.

Those clubs that wish to utilize the funds in conjunction with District Managed Grants will be required to comply with District Managed Grants protocol. Please be aware that remaining DMG funds are limited and may be exhausted before the March 31, 2021 deadline.

Terry Quinn Became our Newest Member, Today!

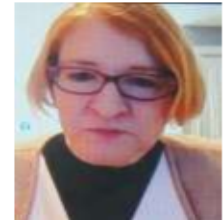

DGN Note from Tari's Desk

Demystifying the DG TRACK, what we actually do to prepare to be DG.



Greetings all. This month sharing one thought, and that is **LET ROTARY be a FAMILY THING!** The pictures below are of my Dad's Rotary (he is in the back row—second from the left facing picture). Then there is my son and I doing things together or separately. Dad's Rotary was exactly as you see it—all men, in suits and ties and long meals with Marlborough cigarettes, after dinner drinks and hours of time on their hands because they were in charge of their own schedules. My Rotary is one where I am happy to wear jeans and a T-Shirt traveling from country to country visiting Clubs BUT doing hands on work as my preference much more so than sitting eating meals. And then my son. He joined the Rotary Surfers' Fellowship.

Wears the ballcap all the time (including at meals at times!) His generation will text multiple times during a meal and will even text me at the same table. And that is OK. If asked he will put in 12 hours of work for a cause—but don't waste his time in board meetings that go on for hours without decisions being made. EACH of these versions is Rotary. Nothing wrong with any on them—just different times. Listen to stories of the more traditional Rotary and celebrate the history. Know Rotary will be a mix of check writers and do-ers or both—but it is OK to have a mix of one or the other as well. And finally—future Rotary is now. It is changing somewhat—embrace the change but let us know as well when you feel you are missing out because sometimes we get on the fast train and forget to see the scenery along the way. **There is room in Rotary for all of it.** And the World is a better place **with Rotary IN IT!**

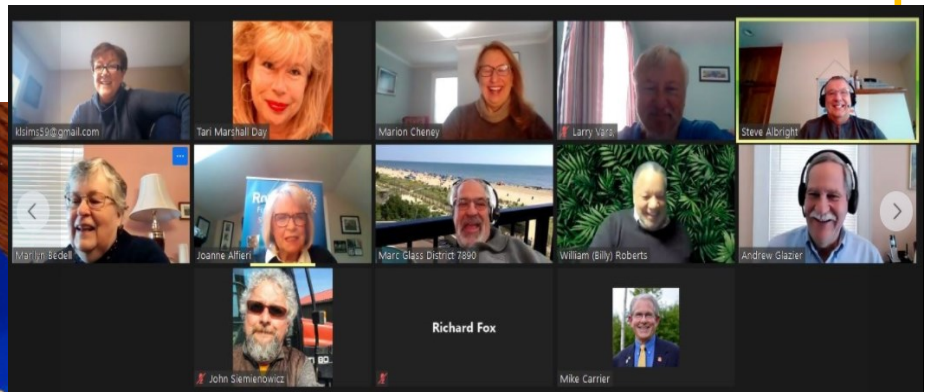
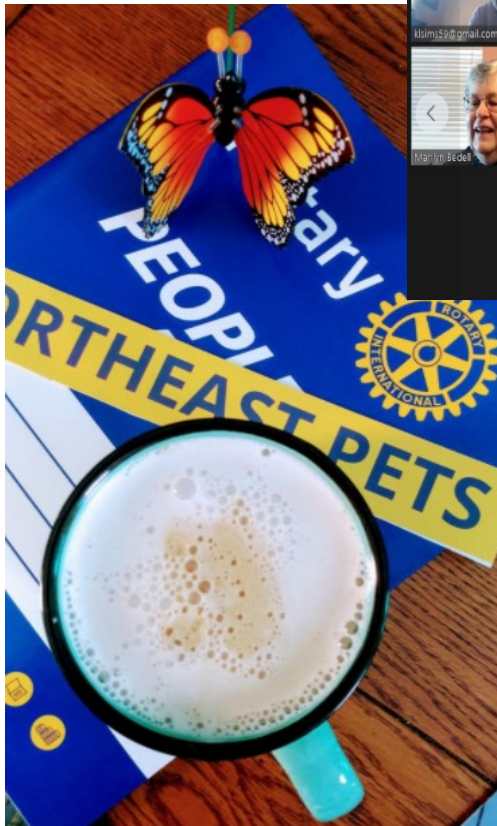
