Life Enrichment Options (LEO) is a community non-profit founded over 30 years ago to support and advocate for children with developmental disabilities through housing, employment, education and recreation opportunities.



The Challenge Series Races is a LEO-affiliated recreation event puts these children in contact with non-disabled youth to have fun. Using LEO's soapbox derby-type race cars, a non-disabled driver is paired with a disabled rider in 2-car gravity races on a downhill course. Each rider will pair with several drivers during the event so that everyone finishes first at least once.
