














Service Projects Areas of Focus




Overwhelming majority of respondents agree about Club Service Projects:

What is your Opinion on the Number of Service Projects





- Malaria eradication which is a RI project. Maybe some fundraising with Malaria dinners like the polio dinners could be a good project. I would prefer not to spearhead this but willing to help.
- Am working at the Thrift Shop independent of Rotary
- A community-wide event such as the marathon... maybe not that big, but that was a lovely way to serve our entire community.
- I think we can do more helping low-income families in the Seattle area understand about education, nutrition (especially for children) and home finances.
- Art education




What do you want from your membership?








THANK YOU FOR YOUR INPUT. PLEASE ADD ANY OTHER COMMENTS AND SUGGESTIONS:




