Report on Leadership/Planning Meeting Jan

January 9th, about 25 club members met to discuss our club's past and future directions. Our facilitator was Judy MacCully, from the Shoreline Rotary Club, assisted by Bill MacCully. We discovered and shared our own leadership gifts, reflected on progress made and directions changed from the last (2010) Strategic Plan, and focused on actions we can take in the next six months and beyond to improve our club.

In the session on our own leadership gifts we found that we are servers, teachers, perceivers, givers, encouragers, compassionate and administrators by virtue of those factors that motivate us. We noted that each gift has strengths and weaknesses. Recognizing our own as well as those of others will help us to keep in mind the different perspectives our members bring to the club and how we can each be most effective.

In terms of actions we plan to work on now, four areas stood out:

Membership – ways we can revise and simplify how we identify and incorporate new members

Participation – creating meeting time to hear more from members about our club activities, encouraging and recognizing participants


International service – creating scholarship opportunities for Rotaractors to work and travel with us to participate in international projects

Community service – encouraging and pursuing a club focus on reducing homelessness among teens and young adults in the U District
