

Project Pocket Change by Lawrie Payne





Pocket Change is a program designed to raise funds by collecting the pocket change accumulated each day of the week, by members and their families, depositing it into a provided container and returning the funds to the club at a meeting. No tax receipts will be available for the donations.

The funds will be used to support a program of University of Washington Medicine designed to improve the ability of Primary Care Physicians in the early diagnosis of Alzheimer's disease and to guide patients, family and caregivers in advanced care planning through years of affliction.

While somewhat different in its procedure, this project is similar to 1200 Rotary Clubs on the Eastern Seaboard that have raised \$6,500,000 to date for the cause of Alzheimer's research and has been approved by our Club's Community Service Committee.
