U District Rotarians Support Mini-Greenhouses in Mexico (by Susan Sola)

A recent visit by Rotarians Susan Sola and Marilee Fuller to the Family Greenhouse Project in the high, arid Mixteca region of Oaxaca, Mexico, showed very positive results. Funding from University District Rotary and several Mexican clubs over three years has built more than 100 greenhouses, several of them at marginalized schools.

A US\$325 greenhouse, 10 m. x 5 m. x 3 m., with recipient labor and contribution, produces enough vegetables to feed a family of six for a year, plus some to sell or barter. Drip irrigation saves water and cuts maintenance time. Children

help in greenhouses and learn about plant cultivation and nutrition in schools with greenhouses.

This sustainable project has brought poor, isolated rural farm families together, creating opportunities for collaboration, support and problem-solving—building community and keeping families together. Farmers are trying new crops beyond tomatoes: strawberries, cilantro, green beans, etc. There is a long waiting list for greenhouses, and there is interest from neighboring areas.

The project has strengthened the local Rotary club and is attracting new members. As men no longer have to leave home to look for work elsewhere, and the rural family's basic food needs are covered, exciting possibilities for economic development are beginning to arise!
