He manages the foundation's polio grant portfolio, which provides funding to support the Global Polio Eradication Initiative's efforts around the world. Aaron received a Master in Public Administration from the UW and a B.A in History and Political Science from the

University of Minnesota-Twin Cities. He has experience working with a variety of global nonprofit organizations on issues ranging from U.S.-Latin American relations to youth education. Aaron lives in Seattle with his wife and daughter.

Please join us on World Polio Day, October 24th, for this inspirational event celebrating progress and highlighting continuing efforts in the global fight to eradicate polio. At the event you will have an opportunity to hear directly from U.S. Representatives Jim McDermott (D, WA-7), and Adam Smith (D, WA-9), representatives from the Gates Foundation and Rotary International, and special guest Dennis Ogbe, a Nigerian-born U.S. Paralympian and polio survivor.

Over the past several decades we have made tremendous progress in the global fight to eradicate polio. Thanks to the efforts by many partners including Rotary International and the United Nations Foundation's Shot@Life campaign, polio has been reduced by 99 percent around the world. Additionally, Nigeria recently passed one year without a single diagnosed case of polio, leaving only two countries in the world – Pakistan and Afghanistan – with endemic transmission. Despite this progress, the job is not yet finished and significant work remains.
