YOUTH LEADERSHIP DEVELOPMENT

- We provide educational grants or scholarships for students attending:
 - o Eastlake, Skyline, and Eastside Catholic High Schools,
 - Lake Washington Institute of Technology, Renton Technical College, and Bellevue College. Our scholarship at Bellevue College through the Occupational and Life Services program focuses on young adults with learning disabilities
- We sponsor an Interact Club for students at Eastlake High School and support their service activities.
- We recognize a Student of the Month at our weekly meetings, where students are chosen from area high schools for recognition in specific academic areas.

COMMUNITY SERVICE

We provide "feet on the ground" and support the following local community service opportunities:

- Harvesting produce for local food banks through Harvest Against Hunger at Elk Run Farms.
- Staffing shopping days twice a month at Issaquah Food and Clothing Bank, stocking food and helping clients shop.
- Volunteering for Eggstravaganza with the YMCA and the Mud Run with Sammamish Friends.
- Building Tiny Homes through Sound Foundations
- Volunteering and supporting HopeFest, a one-day event organized by student volunteers that provides services and support for low-income individuals.
- Supporting LifeWire, a program for survivors of domestic violence, and other nonprofit organizations in our community receive grants and volunteer time.

INTERNATIONAL

Sammamish Rotary believes in bringing access to opportunity to those who have been denied the basics that many of us take for granted: food, clean water, and environment, education, freedom to engage in business entrepreneurship, land ownership. For the past 15 years, our focus has been on underserved populations in Tanzania and central America.

- In Tanzania, we partnered with Songeas Kids to bring educational opportunities to orphan children in Songea. Our project also supplied drinking water, a healthcare clinic, and entrepreneurial support, in the building of Hope Village, the boarding school that would become the home for the orphans.
- In Central America, we have partnered with Agros International to support land ownership, market-led agriculture, financial empowerment, and health and wellbeing.
 - Sammamish Rotary currently has a Rotary Global Grant with Agros benefitting the people of the Ixil region of Guatemala. T
 - The grant helps fund the Healthy Start program, which supports health and nutrition while building entrepreneurship among women.
