Transforming Tiny Lives: Your Impact in Action



Neonatal Ventilation Humidifier

A newborn's respiratory system is reliant on humidity to maintain physiological balance, assist natural defense mechanisms, and conserve energy for growth and development. The new Ventilation Humidifier provides NICU caregivers more advanced modes of ventilation for babies and provide more advanced care. Additionally, the humidifier provides better temperature control and is much more comfortable for the baby.

Family Centred Care/Kangaroo Care

Research shows that even very sick premature infants are much more stable while being held skin to skin with their parent, called 'kangaroo care'. More hours in kangaroo care are better for both baby and parents. A kangaroo chair is a hospital grade recliner that allows parents to hold their sick baby during kangaroo care. The chair easily reclines and is very comfortable, especially for new mothers that are required to sit with babies in kangaroo care for a long period of time. Because of you, the KGH NICU was able to purchase 3 of these new chairs to replace older chairs that are well-loved.

Neonatal Bilipad

Many newborn babies require phototherapy for physiological jaundice. Traditionally this would require babies to be admitted to the NICU, placed in an incubator and undergo phototherapy lights. The KGH NICU now has a bilibed which allows to have phototherapy occur in the parent's room, thus keeping mom and baby together. The new bilipad allows babies to be held and fed by parents and can be wrapped with the pad and continuously receive therapy. Prior to the bilipad arriving, the NICU used overhead LED lights that are identical in effectiveness but does not allow for babies to be picked up by their parents and receive therapy. The bilipad's phototherapy supports family-centered care and newborn development, which is vital to baby's care.



Parent Beds

The KGH NICU is very busy department that cares for families throughout the interior and other parts of British Columbia. When a baby is admitted to the NICU, parents spend long periods of time at their bedside, often sleeping overnight. The NICU period is stressful for families and a time of transition. With the new parent beds, families have the ability to be by their babies side comfortably and laydown to get much needed rest when they can. When parents are able to stay at the bedside, it helps the baby stabilize physiologically, mom can produce milk with specific antibodies needed for baby, and helps with the psychological adjustment to being a new parent. Because of these chairs, parents can be active caregivers and see their baby's milestones.
