Council on Legislation

The Council on Legislation (COL) meets every three years to vote on legislation. The following enactments, selected by the Council Operations Committee, will be considered by the representatives ahead of the COL. Those items that receive more than 80% of eligible votes in support of the item shall be considered on a consent agenda for the 2022 COL. Those items that receive greater than 80% of eligible votes opposing the item will be considered rejected by the Council and will not be considered further at the meeting of the COL. The purpose of this vetting process is to make the COL more efficient by more easily considering those items that have widespread support or opposition.
