The Rotary Club of Pullman is pleased to announce the **2026 Irving M. Field Grand Project for Community Enhancement**. This program provides funding for projects or services that improve the Pullman community.

The word “Grand” in the title reflects back to 1979 when the concept was initiated by then-Pullman Rotary President **Irv Field**, who invited proposals for projects costing up to \$1,000, or a “grand”. Today, grants of up to **\$1,500** are available. The only requirement for submission is that the proposed project helps improve the Pullman community in some meaningful way.

Since 1979, the Rotary Club of Pullman has funded **more than 50 projects** through this program. A list of recent award recipients is enclosed.

Applications may be submitted by members of the community at large, including charitable organizations, schools, city government, individuals or Rotary Club Members. Proposals may be submitted for projects needing up to **\$1,500**.

Applications will be reviewed and the grant recipient(s) will be announced in **early May**.

Projects submitted to the Rotary Club of Pullman may also be considered for a **Rotary District 5080 District Grant- Local Project**. Conditions apply, but qualifying projects selected for District review may eligible for **matching funds up to \$5,000**, creating the potential for a **\$10,000 community project**.

We encourage you to submit ideas that will help strengthen and enhance the Pullman community.
