Building a New Generation of Leaders



Debi Dockins and Kevin Sharrai gave us an overview of the RYLA program. RYLA stands for Rotary Youth Leadership Awards and is an intensive leadership experience organized by Rotary clubs and districts where young adults develop skills as a leader while having fun and making connections.

RYLA is open to young adults ages 18-25. Each RYLA session is

eight days long, with each day running from 7 am to 9 pm. Usual attendance is fifty to sixty participants. Each day is full of special sessions on everything about leadership and stewardship.

Clubs can sponsor one or more attendees, chosen by the club. The cost is \$800 plus transportation to/from camp. This summer's session will be held on the University of Idaho campus from June 28th to July 5th.
