





for Sponsorships, which are \$100. A sign-up sheet is going around and tickets are available.

Pat Burke and Dennis were collecting for the Club Foundation. Give early and often.


Dennis started with James. Dennis reflected on James almost missing the Flag Salute to begin the meeting.

Steve Day – bragged on our speaker and PCC – Precision Castparts Corp. He mentioned their involvement with La Salle and student opportunities.


Mike Berrevoets – had a TARTL with Fred and had to leave early.



Andrea – thanked Laura and the chamber for donating 5 boxes of note books to La Salle.


Mr. Bill brought in a photo of past presidents from 2003. Tax season has started so file early and file often.

Ed Hacmac – TARTL with President and Sgt. at Arms.





Renee King – mentioned that Aurora and Kaylee were probably at the CTC in the Coach Dennis mentioned.


Ed Gronke – mentioned his son taking students to Iowa. Then reminded the members that some time ago he






