Presentation: Getting Things Done When You Can't Be Together – Shari Storm. Shari entertained AND educated the group with her lively, funny presentation. She provided new perspectives on the world we find ourselves in, specifically in terms of Covid. She reminded the group that while Zoom has been a wonderful addition to our ways of connecting, you still can't make direct eye contact with someone (if you're looking at them/you're not looking at the camera) and there is always a slight lag or delay in the transmission. A tip she gave was to have a catch phrase for when you need or should take a moment to gather your thoughts before speaking: Ex. Huuuuuh? Or "I really value you/your contribution to the organization......" She shared some fun examples of ritual around an employee leaving that helps them leave on a positive note, emphasizing that the way you treat people as they leave is the way they will represent you to others and that this is also true for Rotary.
