Frances said that the District grant did not specify Head Start as our only potential partner. —Don will update us and check with Fred Meyer as needed.

- Josh announced that his business startup <u>1775.Coffee</u>, a mail-order coffee roaster, will donate a part of each sale to a non-profit. Their motto is "Every Cup Gives Back". The Albina Rotary Club Foundation is included in their list!
- Josh also plans a donation to our Foundation to be used for creating club banners. He plans to use them to spread our name around at Japanese Rotary clubs, where they are very popular.
