David and Laura showed us a video about Shelter Box, an international organization started by Rotarians in Cornwall, England. It is now independent but still affiliated with Rotary. David is a Shelter Box response team member who has worked in 9 countries; Lora was a regional Shelter Box Ambassador in 2021.

Since 2001, 230 Shelter Box missions have assisted 1½ million people in 100 countries after disasters (2/3 have been flooding). Their boxes contain sturdy tents, hygiene and cooking equipment and a package of useful basic tools that enable people to improve their situation. Our club foundation has donated \$4,500 to Shelter Box.
