Report of 3/24/2017 and 4/29/2017 Service Projects by Ted Ricks

What has the LO Interact Club done for our community in 2017?



Lolli Pasotti and I joined six Rotarians in a community day of service at the Campbell Garden yesterday from 9:00-11:00 on Friday, March 24<sup>th</sup> – Community Service Day, despite the occasional rain. We planted 100 new flowers and plants and pulled up 300 invasive plants to complete our service under the supervision of the City Naturalists.

The Campbell Garden on Iron Mountain Road is dedicated to the memory of former

Rotary President Harold Campbell and open to the public to learn of native plants and flowers.



On Saturday, April 29<sup>th</sup>, Stuart Allen, Savannah Grosse, and I joined hundreds of Lake Oswego citizens in raising funds for the Zambian people to build wells, sanitation, and wash basins.



Citizens paid for the right to demonstrate their support by walking from Millennium Park to Foothill Park emptying the water in the Willamette River, hence Walk4Water. LO Interactors, Stuart and Savannah dipped the marchers' buckets in Oswego Lake and gave them to the marchers. There were musicians and food provided to add to the festive atmosphere throughout the morning.
