Dear Mr. Bazzaz and Members of the Lake Oswego Rutary:

The Iraqi Children Foundation (formerly the Sponsor Iraqi Children Foundation) is pleased to report that your generous 2013 donation of \$23,019.25 fully timded 3 months of services at a safe haven in Baghdad for very vulnerable Iraqi orphans and street children.

The 2013 budget for this special center was approximately \$86,400 or \$21,600 per quarter with adjustments, especially for the cost of multilion. The Lake Oswego Rotary donation was applied to the September-November cuarter. Other quarters thring the year were funded by the ICF Board members donations, a 5K fundraiser, and other major conditions.

Expenses for each quarter include salaries for a teacher and two social workers, nutrition (about \$55 per month per child), rent for the Center, classroom and recreation supplies, a driver and his bus, a cook and goard, a generator and Center maintenance. The manager is currently working without pay.

We are happy to report that this is what the Center was able to accomplish for these Iraqi orphans and street children in one year:

- * 120 children (regular and part time) attended the Center, with 55-60 attending daily on average
- * 30.960 est, healthy meals were served to address malnutrition in many of the kids
- * 63 children received medical care for skin disease, diautica, dental issues, typhoid, etc.
- * 31 children stopped working because of the Center's intervention. Others out work by est, 60%
- * 17 children enrolled in regular public school because the Certer worked with facir families
- * 2 girls (12 and 13) were saved from early marriage through intervention by Conter staff
- 1.13 children received logal help in family court from lawyers working with the Conter-
- * 18 cases resulted in a decline in family violence after Conter staff intervened with mediation

Center staff also provided extra care to children suffering from psychological problems due to serious tranmafrom sexual abuse, extreme violence, witnessing the murder of family members, disorder in sexual behavior, and being treated in a humiliating way for a long period.

There are occasional variations in the Center's budget because of the cost of food, security concerns that require fewer visits to homes or even on rare occasion the closing of the Center, and other factors.

From This to.....









Meet two children the Center is helping....

- Two brothers have been registered recently at the center, 9 years and ten years old. Their mother committed suicide three years ago by burning herself because of despair over poverty and abuse by her husband who beat her severely. The two brothers now live with an aunt and are experiencing happiness at the center where the team provides them with loving care.
- A 10 year old girl regularly attends the center and is doing well with her classwork. However, her family forces her to work as a condition of attending the center. She has to go to work after she leaves the center and sometimes must work late at night, collecting empty soda cans from the garbage to earn for her family about \$12 a day. They threaten her that if she doesn't bring in that amount, she will have to spend the night outside and not go to the center the next day. She suffers a lot from the stress of this situation.
